### **Activity 1**

EYFS teachers, or early years teachers, work with children primarily between the ages of 3 and 5, though some do work with children as young as 2. These teachers are responsible for delivering the EYFS to all children in their care and must come up with play-based activities to do so. Teachers also assist in the preparation of reports and assessments, as well as delivering this information to parents and carers in meetings. EYFS teachers typically work in nurseries, pre-schools, centres that provide school reception classes, and private schools. Salary levels vary depending on the sector and location of employment, but generally start out at approximately £15,000 per year.

### **Activity 2**

The majority of EYFS teachers advance or are promoted out of teaching before reaching 20 years of service. Many opt to take additional classes, leading to roles in senior management or primary education. Others receive promotions to head-teacher or deputy head teacher at a nursery or pre-school. Some individuals specialise their careers, focusing on children with special education needs. Teachers who wish to step out of the classroom for a while altogether may consider searching for a role as an inspector for either Ofsted or the Independent Schools Council, both of which hire former EYFS teachers on a regular basis.
